What to expect in this post: practical, creative, and out-of-the-box ideas

Section 1: Quick Fun with a Purpose – Icebreakers & Bonding Games

Scripture Bingo

Here is how you can play Scripture Bingo as one of your fun activities for ladies' church groups!

To begin, gather a group of participants who are interested in engaging with Scripture in a fun and interactive way.

Create Bingo cards filled with various Scripture references or phrases that can be randomly called out during the game.

As the caller reads each reference aloud, players will mark their cards accordingly.

The excitement builds as players try to form a line, either horizontally, vertically, or diagonally, leading to a thrilling race to shout "Bingo!" when someone successfully completes the required pattern.

To enhance the experience, consider incorporating small prizes for the winners, making the game not only a joyful activity but also a meaningful way to deepen one's understanding of Scripture.

Get-to-Know-You Speed Rounds

Here is how to play the game of Get-to-Know-You Speed Rounds as fun activities for ladies' church groups.

Objective: To help women identify personal and common barriers to engaging in spiritual disciplines (especially Bible study) reflect on their experiences and share practical ways to move forward in grace, faith, and community.

In my experience, this type of activity can be difficult to facilitate. You do not want to rush the Holy Spirit or work, but you also don't want to go off track.

As a result, I've included an estimate of how long this activity/discussion can take.

Estimated Duration:
60-75 minutes total

- Opening & Introduction - 10 minutes
- Journaling - 15 minutes
- Pray or Small Group Sharing - 25 minutes
- Closing Prayer & Communion - 10 minutes

Materials Needed:

- Journal or personal journaling sheets (one per person)
- Pens
- Optional: candles (candlelight is a nice touch for creating a peaceful atmosphere)
- A microphone or two (to hear the small group members if needed)
- Optional: background music (instrumental or soft instrumental music is ideal)
- Crystals, with lighting, or a relaxing ambient (optional but helpful)

Room Setup:

- Round tables or small clusters of chairs for small groups
- Central space for the facilitator to speak and pray
- Quiet, reflective atmosphere (consider soft lighting, music, or the background during journaling)

Facilitator Script:

Welcome & Introduction (10 minutes):
"Thank you for showing up today! Today's the first step."

The instructions are easy.

First, prepare a list of fun and intriguing [questions](#) that encourage sharing personal stories and insights.

You can have women sit or stand in a large circle or do concentric circles (one circle inside another).

Each lady will take turns answering a question while the others listen attentively.

After a set time, which can be as short as one minute, the group rotates so that everyone has an opportunity to answer different questions.

This simple format not only helps in breaking the ice but also fosters deeper connections among the members, creating a warm and inviting atmosphere for fellowship and community bonding.

Two Truths and a Blessing

The instructions for the game Two Truths and a Lie are designed to encourage ladies to engage with one another in a fun and lighthearted manner.

You know what this is based on? Yep, Two Truths and a Lie. Sometimes, you have to get creative with your fun activities for ladies ' church groups!

Each lady takes turns sharing three statements about themselves—two of which are true things about them that others may not know.

Then, they are to share a future blessing they are trusting God for. Encourage the ladies to pray for those items if they'd like.

This game can lead to uplifting conversations and deeper connections. They will have an opportunity to learn new and interesting facts about one another, enhancing relationships and creating memorable moments together.

“God’s Gifts” scavenger hunt

As you know, we all have gifts God has given us.

This is one of my fun activities for ladies ' church groups because it encourages women to celebrate who they are in God!

The directions for a God gifts scavenger hunt are easy.

The goal is to give women a delightful opportunity to reflect on and celebrate the innate gifts that God has blessed them with.

Explain that these gifts, which can be closely related to their individual personalities or unique spiritual abilities, serve as a reminder of their value and purpose in the world.

Ask them to think of their top 3 God-given gifts.

Next, tell the women to items or tokens that resonate with their specific qualities or talents. They can look around the room, in their handbags, and talk to other women to see what they have.

**Once, I had a woman go to the bathroom to grab a tissue. It's important to communicate that they have the freedom to do what they need to do. They just need to be creative in connecting it to their strengths.*

As they collect these treasures, they engage in meaningful discussions, share their experiences, and ultimately discover a deeper appreciation for themselves and the divine gifts they embody.

Bible-themed Pictionary

How can women play a fun game of Bible Pictionary? Easily!

Here are the instructions and what you will need to create an enjoyable and engaging experience for everyone involved.

First, gather the ladies or break them into groups.

Next, you need some basic art supplies, such as paper, markers, or whiteboards. I'm old-school and like to use giant chart paper. Every ministry needs chart paper and markers.

You will need a list of Bible stories, characters, or verses to base your drawings on.

Each player will take turns selecting a word or phrase, which they will then try to illustrate without using any letters or verbal clues.

To keep the energy high and the laughter flowing, set a timer for each round and encourage creativity, even if the drawings don't quite resemble the intended subject.

After each round, you will allow the other players to guess what the drawing represents and award points for correct answers.

You can do this in teams or women can work as one big team.

This interactive game not only tests artistic skills but also deepens knowledge of the Bible in a fun and memorable way!

Section 2: Makeup & Beauty with a Christian Twist

Organize a Makeup Class

God has not convicted me about makeup. I'm free. However, if your denomination does not allow it, that is between you, them and God.

This fun activity is for the women's ministry that has no problem with makeup or cosmetics.

Here is what you can do:

Option 1: Invite a Christian makeup artist or beauty consultant (e.g., Mary Kay or Avon)

Option 2: Find a YouTube video demonstrating a makeup look. Then you all try to do it together.

This can be such a fun time! However, before the fun, tell the women what makeup to bring and ask them to bring small mirrors and anything else they need based on the time you'll spend watching the video.

If you do this in person, have them bring small mirrors and whatever else they need based on the time you spend viewing the video. I got mine at the Dollar Store.

Next, have a devotional on "Inner Beauty"

Section 4: Try Something Completely New!

Learning a New Skill = Confidence + Fellowship

Create a Women's Ministry Podcast

I recommend doing this over two nights. Here is a **simplified two-night plan** for a fun and engaging women's ministry activity where the group learns how to create a podcast together:

Podcast Night (2-Part Activity)

Goal: Teach participants how to plan, record, and share a short podcast episode as a group.

Night 1 – Plan Your Podcast

1. **Welcome + Icebreaker**
Go around the room: “If you had a podcast, what would it be called?”
2. **What’s a Podcast?**
Briefly explain podcasts and share examples, especially Christian ones.
3. **Pick a Topic**
Let each group choose a theme (faith, encouragement, testimonies, etc.).
4. **Create an Episode Plan**
Use a simple template to write an intro, key points, and closing.
5. **Practice Time**
Groups do a quick run-through of their scripts to get comfortable.

Night 2 – Record + Celebrate

1. **Quick Devotional + Tech Demo**
Open in prayer. Show how to use a phone or laptop to record.
2. **Rehearse + Record**
Each group practices, then records their short episode (5–10 minutes).
3. **Playback + Applause**
Listen together and celebrate! Optional: upload or share the audio privately.
4. **Wrap-Up**
Reflect on how this can be used for ministry or ongoing creativity.

Supplies Needed:

- Smartphones or laptops
- Simple mic (optional)
- Printed planning sheets
- Quiet room

Section 5: DIY & Hands-On Projects

Prayer Jar Craft

Decorate a Scripture Canvas

You can model this activity after the painting projects that are so popular these days.

An idea could be to start by having each woman select a meaningful verse or passage that resonates with them personally and reflects their beliefs.

Next, gather the necessary materials such as a blank canvas, acrylic paints, brushes, and stencils. They might also want to include embellishments like washi tape, glitter, or rhinestones to add a unique touch.

Once the women have everything ready, they sketch out their chosen Scripture lightly on the canvas with a pencil, ensuring it's centered and balanced.

Then, use bold colors to paint the letters and background, allowing your creativity to shine as you blend shades and create textures.

After the paint dries, consider outlining the Scripture with fine-tipped markers for crispness and extra detail.

Finally, finish off by adding their embellishments to highlight the beauty of the verse, making sure to seal your canvas with a protective spray to preserve their artwork for years to come.

Make Blessing Bags for the Homeless

To create blessing bags for the homeless, you can include the following items:

- Essential toiletries such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap, and deodorant to help maintain hygiene
- Non-perishable food items like granola bars, canned soup, and peanut butter
- Warm socks and gloves for colder weather
- A handwritten note of encouragement to brighten their day.

Additionally, consider adding items such as reusable water bottles (the insulated kind would be amazing!), blankets, and personal care products, providing them with both comfort and dignity during challenging times.

Beaded Bible Verse Bracelets

Paint a Pot & Plant a Prayer

I love this idea! You can take it in so many directions, Christian Woman!

You could ask the ladies to write a prayer on a small piece of paper. Then, place it in the bottom of a small clay pot.

Do you see where I am going?

Then add potting soil and a seedling. As the ladies observe the plant grow, they can reflect on how their prayer is being answered on this side of heaven or on the other side.

Section 6: Unique DIY Projects & Life Skills

Sand & Refinish a Table (Group effort!)

This is a bit selfish. I have a table to re-sand as I type this. I'm so intimidated to begin the process that I wish I had some ladies to help! haha

With this sort of project, you want to make the table reasonably portable so that it can stay at the location until the stain dries.

Garage Sale Treasure Hunt for Ministry Supplies

You could also do a garage sale scavenger hunt! That could be so fun!

Organize a Closet Purge Party

I thought of this years ago. You'll love this as one of your fun activities for ladies ' church groups!

See, women likely have so many clothes and accessories they'd love to unload. You can have your own women's ministry postmark!

Budgeting and Coupon Night

Organize a "Fix It Friday" Toolbox Party

It won't be easy to set up, but if you are interested, here is how to organize a "Fix It Friday" Toolbox Party for a women's ministry activity.

Create an inviting atmosphere with decorations and light refreshments to encourage conversation.

Set up stations for specific projects like upcycling furniture or crafting handmade gifts, led by confident members.

Promote the event through church bulletins and social media to attract a larger crowd. Remember to empower each other by sharing ideas and experiences, making this Toolbox Party both productive and a meaningful community-building experience.

This women's ministry activity not only strengthens bonds among the ladies, but I think it also encourages personal growth and healing through the art of storytelling.

Host a "Blessing Box" Build & Stock Night

Here is how to plan an event, Host a "Blessing Box" Build & Stock Night, for your women's ministry.

First of all, let me say, this event will not only encourage community involvement but also provide an opportunity to support those in need.

Begin by gathering volunteers from the women's ministry who are passionate about outreach and organizing events.

Create a detailed checklist that includes selecting a suitable date and venue that can accommodate all participants, and ensure access to materials needed for the Blessing Boxes, such as non-perishable food items, personal care products, and uplifting notes.

Promote the event through social media, church bulletins, and community boards to attract participants and donations.

During the event, set up various stations where attendees can build the boxes, stock them with items, and write encouraging messages to include.

I am old-school, but I think a colorful flyer would be great! That way, the ladies' can take them and pass them around for donations!

It's also important to curate a selection of appealing auction items, which may include donated goods, services, or unique experiences, to attract bidders and encourage generous contributions.

Promotion of the event is **crucial**, so utilizing social media, church newsletters, and community announcements can help spread the word and boost attendance.

Basic Car Maintenance 101Activity

Empowering Women with Confidence Behind the Wheel

Activity Purpose:

To equip women with essential car maintenance knowledge so they can feel confident, safe, and independent when caring for their vehicles. Perfect for single moms, young adults, or anyone who wants to stop relying on a mechanic for every little thing.

Event Details

- **Title:** Basic Car Maintenance 101
- **Time Required:** 1.5 to 2 hours
- **Location:** Church parking lot or a garage-friendly space
- **Group Size:** 6–20 women
- **Facilitator:** Female mechanic, local car expert, or skilled volunteer
- **Ideal Time to Host:** Spring or early fall (good weather helps)

Materials Needed

- One or two vehicles for demonstrations
- Folding chairs for participants
- Car maintenance checklist printouts

- Disposable gloves, rags, oil dipstick wipes
- Air pressure gauge
- Windshield washer fluid, engine oil, coolant
- Handouts with diagrams (basic parts under the hood)
- Snacks and bottled water (optional)

Agenda / Breakdown

Welcome & Opening (10 minutes)

- Greet everyone with a warm welcome
- Open with a short devotional on stewardship and self-sufficiency (e.g., *Proverbs 31:17*: “She sets about her work vigorously; her arms are strong for her tasks.”)
- Icebreaker: “Name something you’ve always wanted to know about your car but were too afraid to ask.”

Session 1: Under the Hood Basics (30 minutes)

- Show how to open the hood and identify key components:
 - Oil dipstick
 - Windshield washer reservoir
 - Coolant
 - Battery
 - Air filter
- Teach how to check oil level and when it should be changed
- Demonstrate how to top off washer fluid

Session 2: Tires & Safety (30 minutes)

- How to check tire pressure
- What tire tread wear looks like
- How to use a tire gauge
- What to do when the check engine light comes on

Hands-On Practice (20–30 minutes)

- Break into small groups around each car
- Let women take turns practicing:
 - Popping the hood
 - Checking fluids
 - Reading the oil dipstick
 - Using the tire gauge
 - Locating the jack & spare tire

Wrap-Up & Encouragement (10 minutes)

- Recap the key takeaways
- Encourage confidence and share personal stories
- Distribute a **Basic Car Maintenance Checklist for Women** handout
- Optional giveaway: tire gauge or mini emergency kit

Optional Add-ons:

- Invite a guest speaker: Christian woman in automotive or safety
- Create a car maintenance devotional journal printable
- Offer door prizes: keychains, car organizers, gas gift cards

Closing Scripture or Prayer Idea:

Proverbs 31:25 – “She is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come.”
